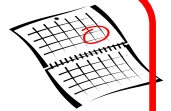

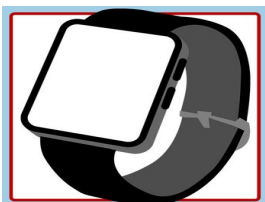
School Spirit Cup

Smart Watches Cellular Feature

Some children have cellular smart watches which allows them to make and receive calls without the need for a phone. This feature is not necessary at school and we ask parents to set the watch so calls cannot be made between the hours of 9.00am - 3.00pm. If students need to contact home we allow them to use the school phone. We have had students contacting their parents to say they are sick and need to come home - the teacher or admin staff have not been informed.



North West Cross Country

On Tuesday our school braved the weather to take on all the other bigger schools at the annual Hamilton North West Cross Country Interschool competition. This event is for the top 8 to 11 year old cross country runners from each school. This year we took a smaller team -20 students- which became even smaller on the day due to sickness and injury.

Our team and supporters were amazing with everybody giving their all. One of the many highlights came at the end of the day when the results were announced and we found that we had come 3rd overall, only 5 points off being second!

Junior Team

On Wednesday 6th September our junior team worked for the day on planning and developing oral resources for their students. The focus was to reflect on the research that states, “Reading and writing float on a sea of talk”, (Barnes 1976). Barnes recommends that teachers learn how to use talk to allow students to explore unknown social or cognitive territory in order to make meaning that is significant to their personal needs and crucial to their learning.

Australasian Literacy Summit

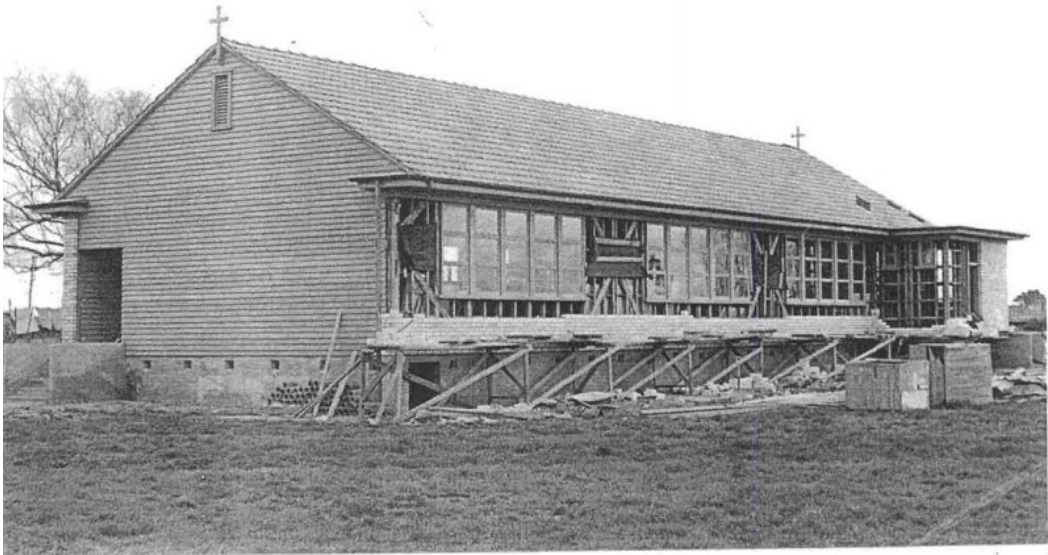

School History

In 1954 a Parish was established in the area of Te Rapa, and parishioners attended Mass in the Beerescourt Hall. Also in 1954, the school/church was constructed. In February 1955, when the construction was completed, the school/church was opened and was dedicated to Saint Peter Chanel (canonised a Saint in 1954). The building was used as a church during the weekends, and a school on Monday to Friday. It consisted of 3 rooms separated by folding doors, the altar was positioned behind another set of folding doors at the end of the building. Every Friday the doors were opened the doors, and desks were moved to the far end while chairs were used for Mass. This arrangement lasted for around ten years until the parish church was built.
