

After School Pick-Up

Traffic management - After School Pick-Up

There is a <u>one-way traffic lane</u> for cars through the school car park, with a pick-up and drop-off zone by the hall. Staff are stationed at the pick-up and drop-off zone to manage student movement.

Some reminders:

- Avoid using the car park if possible
- It is one-way enter from Vardon Road (not Te Rapa Straight)
- If the traffic is backed up to Vardon Road please do not tag onto the end of the queue as it stops the traffic flow on Vardon Road
- Collect your child/ren at 3.10pm and avoid the congestion
- In the interests of safety, please be very careful when driving around the school car park at busy times. Little people don't always look before they run.
- Students are not permitted to walk through the carpark without adult supervision.
- Parallel parking is permitted behind the staff cars from 2.50 3.10pm

Board of Trustees Report


The Board of Trustees held their monthly meeting on Tuesday 21st May. The business discussed included:

- Welcoming Fred Ramos, new Proprietor's Appointee
- The Principal's and Finance Reports
- Tabling and accepting the 2023 Audited Acounts (these are available on the school website)
- Addressing the minor recommendations made by the auditor
- The school is in a financially sound position due to the adept management by the Board and school administration team
- The Annual Report prepared by the Proprietor's Appointees for the Bishop regarding the maintenance of the Catholic Character at St Peter Chanel Catholic School
- The changed scope of work for junior block refurbishment (due to escalating costs) and the timeframe for the multi-purpose room (start date is still unclear)

Times Tables

This term we are continuing on our mission to have all our Year 3 - 8 students learn and know the timetables. Many children can find learning their times tables challenging; it requires a high level of both patience and dedication. Parents can assist at home by teaching and coaching their children.

There are a number of positives for children in learning and knowing the timetables:

- It is a form of daily mental training that can considerably improve cognitive functions
- It enhances the ability to fully understand multiplication, have fluency, and instant recall which boosts your children's confidence in the subject
- Students become aware of the patterns of maths
- Multiplication is fundamental for enabling your child to succeed in what can
 often be considered a daunting subject.
- It can also boost communication skills, improve memory and make rehearsals
 of speeches or scripts easier, help gain analytical and numerical skills
- As a child becomes faster at recalling multiplications of 2 -10, they will be able to solve more complex maths in much less time.


NETBALL
