# **Board of Trustees Report**

The Board held their monthly meeting on Tuesday 18th February and discussed the following:

- The Principal, Director of Religious Studies and Finance Reports
- The Board Chair must be elected at the first meeting of every year Derek Burrough was re-elected for 2025
- A number of formalities and reports required by the school auditors were signed off:
   Cyclical Maintenance Plan 2025, School's Annual Accrual Report, Payroll Errors Report, Notional Lease Costs, and the confirmed 2025 Budget
- A Memorandum of Understanding was signed between SPC and St Andrews Middle School relating to our students attending technicraft classes at SAMS
- The annual Catholic Character Compliance Attestation questionnaire was completed
- Part of the new NZ English Curriculum was viewed
- Part of the new NZ Maths Curriculum was viewed
- The above documents are comprehensive and are being viewed positively by the teachers. There was discussion on how we deliver relevant parent information ....watch this space
- Curriculum Insights and Progress Study last year our Year 8 students were invited to
  participate in a national Writing and Numeracy study. Our students, as a cohort,
  scored higher than the national average, a testament to our use of Writers Toolbox
  and strong Maths teaching
- AIMS Games, fundraising and sponsorship. It was decided to proceed with a survey of parents to ascertain their views on these activities. The feedback will help with planning for the future.
- The building of the multi-purpose room is progressing. The concrete footing and floor will be laid within the next week or two.

#### **Donation Scheme**

As many of you may be aware the Government offered schools funding of \$150.00 per student for 2025, in lieu of parent donations. The Board of Trustees accepted the offer. As a result of this, our school will not be asking parents for school donations in 2025. The Government funding we receive will cover the costs of all school day trips, inter-school sports events, Year 7/8 technicraft costs, Mathletics, Write that Essay, Religious Education and performances. funding will not cover the costs of overnight school camps, individual stationery and school uniform items. Optional sports activities that happen outside of school hours such as netball, hockey, basketball, touch etc. will remain user pays. Private music lessons will also remain user pays. are grateful for the assistance this funding provides for our students and their families. 
