#### Rangiaowhia

Last week, the Year 7 & 8 St Peter Chanel School students went to the Rangiaowhia invasion commemoration. Rangiaowhia is now a beautiful farming area near Kihikihi. In the early days it was once a land where the Ngati Apahura people grew fruit trees, such as peaches, and wheat for flour. Both Anglican and Catholic missionaries settled there and built churches. British Troops invaded the peaceful, thriving village and killed many people, the Catholic church was burnt, and the village destroyed. This tragic event occurred on Sunday the 21st of February 1864. Every year the Catholic diocese and Ngati Apakura descendants organise a commemoration and liturgy, so the story can be shared and never be forgotten.

#### **Donation Scheme**

As many of you may be aware the Government offered schools funding of \$150.00 per student for 2025, in lieu of parent donations. The Board of Trustees accepted the offer. As a result of this, our school will not be asking parents for school donations in 2025. The Government funding we receive will cover the costs of all school day trips, inter-school sports events, Year 7/8 technicraft costs, Mathletics, Write that Essay, Religious Education and performances. The funding will not cover the costs of overnight school camps, individual stationery and school uniform items. If your child is away it is vital you contact the school office and let them know.


